

THE ACADEMIC PROCESSION

he processional begins as the candidates for degrees march onto Alumni Lawn, school by school. Each group is preceded by a banner bearer and led by the dean and the Founder's Medalist for the school. The candidates move toward the platform from five directions.

I

Entering from the rear of the audience is the College of Arts and Science, marching in two columns and led by:

Dean Carolyn Dever, College of Arts and Science, followed by candidates for the degree of bachelor of arts. Their banner has a white field.

H

Entering from the rear to the left of the audience are two schools: the Law School and the School of Medicine. They are led by:

Dean Chris Guthrie, Law School, followed by the faculty and the candidates for the degrees of master of laws and doctor of jurisprudence. Their banner has a purple field.

Dean Bonnie M. Miller, School of Medicine, followed by the faculty and the candidates for the degrees of doctor of audiology, master of education of the deaf, master of science (speech-language pathology), master of public health, master of science in clinical investigation, master of laboratory investigation, doctor of medical physics, master of medical physics, and doctor of medicine. Their banner has a green field.

Ш

Entering from the left of the audience near the platform is the **Graduate School** led by:

Vice Provost and Dean Dennis G. Hall, followed by the faculty and the candidates for the degrees of master of arts, master of fine arts, master of science, master of engineering, master of liberal arts and science, and doctor of philosophy. The banner for the doctor of philosophy has a dark blue field.

IV

Entering to the right of the audience are **Peabody College** and the **School of Nursing.** They are led by:

Dean Camilla P. Benbow, Peabody College, followed by the graduate faculty and the candidates for the degrees of doctor of education, master of education, master of public policy, and bachelor of science. Their banner has a light blue field.

Dean Colleen Conway-Welch, School of Nursing, followed by the faculty and the candidates for the degrees of doctor of philosophy, doctor of nursing practice, and master of science in nursing. Their banner has an apricot field.

V

Entering from the rear to the right of the audience are four schools: the Blair School of Music, the School of Engineering, the Divinity School, and the Owen Graduate School of Management. They are led by:

Associate Dean Melissa K. Rose, Blair School of Music, followed by candidates for the degree of bachelor of music. Their banner has a pink field.

Dean Kenneth F. Galloway, School of Engineering, followed by candidates for the degrees of bachelor of engineering and bachelor of science. Their banner has an orange field.

Dean James Hudnut-Beumler, Divinity School, followed by the faculty and the candidates for the degrees of master of divinity and master of theological studies. Their banner has a scarlet field.

Dean James W. Bradford, Owen Graduate School of Management, followed by the faculty and the candidates for the degrees of master of business administration, master of accountancy, master of science in finance, and master of management in health care. Their banner has a light brown field.

fter the candidates are seated, trumpets will sound a fanfare and the first part of the academic procession will enter from the back of the audience. The order is:

Provost Richard C. McCarty and Vice Chancellor Jeffrey R. Balser leading in the professors emeriti and the faculty.

After the faculty have entered, another trumpet fanfare will sound, and the second part of the academic procession will enter. The order is:

The Symbols and Regalia

The visual symbols of Vanderbilt University communicate our rich history and our vibrant future. The oak tree is a traditional symbol for education as well as for strength and longevity. The stylized oak leaf and acorn in the Vanderbilt logo were inspired by motifs from the Vanderbilt family coat of arms. The predominant colors in the Vanderbilt coat of arms are black and gold. The initial "V" has been used frequently throughout the years as an architectural detail on campus buildings. The Vanderbilt University wordmark incorporates two typefaces, graphically linking old and new, our history and our future.

The current chair of the Faculty Senate carries the mace, an ancient sign of authority. It is displayed on the front of the podium as the symbol of the university's authority to confer degrees. Symbolic images that decorate the gilded metal of the mace include VU monograms, embattled shields, oak leaves and acorns, irises and magnolias.

The Chancellor's insignia of office is a silver and gilt collar that displays several emblems of the university. The parallel chains of sterling silver are surmounted by alternating Vanderbilt shields and modified Founder's Medals, from which hangs a medallion with an impression of the seal of the university. The decagonal silver frame of the medallion symbolizes the ten schools.

Trustees of the university wear black gowns distinguished by gold piping on the velvet bars of the sleeves. The design of the academic regalia and the colors worn are significant. Undergraduates—those receiving bachelor's degrees—wear tassels signifying the degree they have earned: golden yellow for science, pink for music, and orange for engineering. By tradition, the bachelor of arts degree tassels are black.

The distinguishing mark of the gown is the sleeve: bachelor—a long, pointed sleeve; master—an oblong sleeve open at the wrist; doctor—open, pointed sleeves lined with dark blue satin to signify the Ph.D. Vanderbilt's custom gown for those receiving the doctor of philosophy has antique gold front and back panels and an embroidered "V" on the gown's yoke. Vanderbilt doctoral candidates wear eight-sided velvet tams with gold tassels.

The velvet edging of the doctoral hoods signifies whether the degree is J.D., M.D., Ed.D. or Ph.D.—purple for law, green for medicine, light blue for education, and dark blue for the doctor of philosophy, which may be earned in a number of disciplines. Masters' hoods are edged with white for arts, golden yellow for science, salmon pink for public health, scarlet for theology, light blue for education, orange for engineering, apricot for nursing, and light brown for business. All hoods are lined with silk in colors signifying the institution granting the degree. Vanderbilt hoods are lined in gold and bear a black chevron.

The Banner Bearers

The Nichols–Chancellor's Medal is one of the university's highest honors and is awarded to individuals who define the 21st century and exemplify the best qualities of the human spirit. It was established by Vanderbilt Law School graduate Edward C. Nichols, Jr., and his wife, Janice, in memory of Edward Carmack Nichols and Lucile Hamby Nichols. The medal is presented at Vanderbilt's Senior Class Day and carries a cash prize.

The 2012 Nichols–Chancellor's Medal is presented to Tom Brokaw, one of the most trusted and respected figures in broadcast journalism. A special correspondent for NBC News, Brokaw reports and produces long-form documentaries and provides expertise during election coverage and breaking news events. In 2004, he stepped down after twenty-one years as anchor and managing editor of NBC *Nightly News*. He has received numerous honors, including the Edward R. Murrow Lifetime Achievement Award and the Emmy Award for Lifetime Achievement, and he was named a fellow of the prestigious American Academy of Arts and Sciences. Over the years, he has reported on subjects including race, AIDS, the war on terror, Los Angeles gangs, poverty, literacy, immigration, and the evangelical movement. He has interviewed every president since Lyndon Baines Johnson and covered every presidential election since 1968. He became a bestselling author with the publication of *The Greatest Generation*.

Tim Xu from Vienna, Virginia, is this year's Founder's Medalist for the College of Arts and Science and is graduating with a bachelor of arts.

A recipient of the Harold Stirling Vanderbilt Honor Scholarship, Tim came to Vanderbilt "determined to weave together [his] two compelling interests" in modern European studies and neuroscience. He conducted honors research and studied European politics, history, and literature at Vanderbilt and in France, culminating in his honors thesis examining nineteenth-century European politics and its relation to French psychiatric commitment laws. He served as editor-in-chief of the *Journal of Young Investigators* and the interdisciplinary *Vanderbilt Undergraduate Research Journal*. Among his many honors, Tim was a Barry M. Goldwater Scholar in 2011 and was inducted into Phi Beta Kappa in his junior year. He plans a career in academic medicine, hoping, in his words, "to unlock the mysteries of neurobiology and culture and unite two traditionally divergent views in psychiatry.

Caroline Marie Hart from Saint Peters, Missouri, is this year's Founder's Medalist for the Blair School of Music. She is graduating with a bachelor of music in violin performance.

One of the truly outstanding performers to attend the Blair School, Caroline was awarded the David Rabin Prize, the Jean Keller Heard Prize, the Margaret Branscomb Prize, and the Ada Bell Stapleton/Blanche Henry Weaver Scholarship. She was concertmaster of the Vanderbilt Orchestra and soloist with the Tchaikovsky Concerto, as well as substitute violinist with the Nashville Symphony. Caroline presented four solo recitals and, as a member of the Ars Nova Quartet, performed in New York and Europe. Winner of the Music Teacher's National Association State Young Artist Competition, she was also selected to attend an exchange program at the Royal Academy of Music in London. Caroline played in master classes offered by the Concertmasters of the Cleveland and Pittsburgh Symphonies, as well as members of the Emerson, Juilliard, and Takacs Quartets. She will return to the Aspen Music Festival this summer on a fellowship and attend the University of Michigan in the fall.

Kathryn Elizabeth Maxwell from Saltillo, Mississippi, is this year's Founder's Medalist for the School of Engineering. She is graduating with a bachelor of engineering in chemical and biomolecular engineering.

A recipient of the A. Max and Susan Souby Honor Scholarship, Kathryn worked with chemical engineering professor Kane Jennings for the research component of her Honors degree. She studied the synthesis of thin polymer films, including those for superhydrophobic applications. Last summer, she attended an international scientific conference on nanotechnology in Portland, Oregon, and heard about current research initiatives from around the world. That experience inspired her to pursue a career in research. She has served as co-president of engineering honor society Tau Beta Pi, vice president of the student chapter of the American Institute of Chemical Engineers, secretary of Sigma Phi Lambda, and a volunteer at a local elementary school. This fall, Kathryn will attend the Massachusetts Institute of Technology to pursue her Ph.D. in chemical engineering.

Michael James Beno from Marietta, Georgia, is this year's Founder's Medalist for Peabody College of Education and Human Development. He is graduating with a bachelor of science in early childhood education.

Michael's academic success is outdone only by his promise as a future teacher. He is a consummate example of a learning teacher, consistently and visibly committed to asking the right

Kyle spent four years as a community organizer and served as a volunteer for the Open Door Community in Metro Atlanta, a residential community in the Catholic Worker tradition that advocates on behalf of the oppressed, homeless, and prisoners. Upon entering the Divinity School, he was awarded a Carpenter Scholarship, a full-tuition award for educating the next generation of theologians. Kyle has served as a leader in the Economic Empowerment Coalition, a student organization that educates and advocates for workers' rights and economic justice at Vanderbilt University and in Middle Tennessee. He also is a member of Organized and United for Respect at Vanderbilt (Our Vanderbilt), a community union for promoting economic justice for our University's employees. Next fall, Kyle will pursue doctoral studies in moral theology and Christian ethics at the University of Notre Dame, as well as international peace studies at the Kroc Institute.

Scarlet Amber Jones from Clarksdale, Mississippi, is this year's Founder's Medalist for the Owen Graduate School of Management. She is graduating with a master of business administration.

Scarlet was the recipient of the Henderson and Fitzgerald scholarships and was elected to Beta Gamma Sigma, the business honor society. Elizabeth Reeves Covington from Houston, Texas, is this year's Founder's Medalist from the Graduate School. She is graduating with a doctor of philosophy.

Elizabeth's multidisciplinary background in science and the humanities inspired her to write her dissertation on the influence of late-nineteenth- and early-twentieth-century experimental psychological theories of memory on early-twentieth-century British literature. Elizabeth was the Elizabeth E. Fleming dissertation fellow at the Robert Penn Warren Center for the Humanities, where she was also one of the inaugural fellows at the Center for the Study of Religion and Culture. She served as president of the English Graduate Student Association. She received the English department's Duncan Award for Overall Achievement in the Graduate Career and Young Award for Excellence in Graduate Teaching. She teaches gifted high school students at the Vanderbilt Summer Academy. Next fall, Elizabeth will be a lecturer in the English department at Vanderbilt. He has volunteered with Health Volunteers overseas, International Medical Corps, Surgical Missions International, and Kids First (a Vanderbilt-based pediatric orthopedic surgery medical mission group) in Mexico, Sudan, Palestine, Vietnam, and Bhutan. He has served with the WHO Global Initiative for Emergency and Essential Surgery Training and Education Committee and Health Volunteers Overseas Nurse Anesthesia Steering Committee. In 2012, he was elected to the Sigma Theta Tau International Honor Society in Nursing, Iota Chapter. After graduation, James will pilot a process he developed to better evaluate crisis points in obstetric anesthesia, join Columbia University as faculty in the Nurse Anesthesia Program, and practice as a doctorally prepared CRNA.

Daniel Mark Koehler from Pickerington, Ohio, is this year's Founder's Medalist for the Vanderbilt University School of Medicine. He is graduating with a doctor of medicine.
