


VANDERBILT COMMENCEMENT

THE ACADEMIC PROCESSION

he processional begins as the candidates for degrees march onto Alumni Lawn, school by school. Each group is preceded by a banner bearer and led by the dean and the Founder's Medalist for the school. The candidates move toward the platform from five directions.

I

Entering from the rear of the audience is the College of Arts and Science, marching in two columns and led by:

Interim Dean John Sloop, College of Arts and Science, followed by candidates for the degree of bachelor of arts. Their banner has a white field.

П

Entering from the rear to the left of the audience are two schools: the Law School and the School of Medicine. They are led by:

Dean Chris Guthrie, Law School, followed by the faculty and the candidates for the degrees of master of laws and doctor of jurisprudence. Their banner has a purple field.

Dean Bonnie M. Miller, School of Medicine, followed by the faculty and the candidates for the degrees of doctor of audiology, master of education of the deaf, master of science (speech-language pathology), master of public health, master of science in clinical investigation, master of laboratory investigation, doctor of medical physics, master of health professions education, and doctor of medicine. Their banner has a green field.

Ш

Entering from the left of the audience near the platform is the **Graduate School** led by:

Vice Provost and Interim Dean John G. Geer, followed by the faculty and the candidates for the degrees of master of arts, master of science, master of fine arts, master of liberal arts and science, master of engineering, and doctor of philosophy. The banner for the doctor of philosophy has a dark blue field.

IV

Entering to the right of the audience are **Peabody College** and the **School of Nursing**. They are led by:

Dean Camilla P. Benbow, Peabody College, followed by the graduate faculty and the candidates for the degrees of doctor of education, master of education, master of public policy, and bachelor of science. Their banner has a light blue field.

Dean Linda Norman, School of Nursing, followed by the faculty and the candidates for the degrees of doctor of nursing practice and master of science in nursing. Their banner has an apricot field.

V

Entering from the rear to the right of the audience are four schools: the Blair School of Music, the School of Engineering, the Divinity School, and the Owen Graduate School of Management. They are led by:

Dean Mark Wait, Blair School of Music, followed by candidates for the degree of bachelor of music. Their banner has a pink field.

Dean Philippe M. Fauchet, School of Engineering, followed by candidates for the degrees of bachelor of engineering and bachelor of science. Their banner has an orange field.

Dean Emilie M. Townes, Divinity School, followed by the faculty and the candidates for the degrees of master of divinity and master of theological studies. Their banner has a scarlet field.

Dean M. Eric Johnson, Owen Graduate School of Management, followed by the faculty and the candidates for the degrees of master of business administration, master of accountancy, master of science in finance, and master of management in health care. Their banner has a light brown field.

fter the candidates are seated, trumpets will sound a fanfare and the first part of the academic procession will enter from the back of the audience. The order is:

Provost Susan R. Wente and Vice Chancellor Jeffrey R. Balser leading in the professors emeriti and the faculty.

After the faculty have entered, another trumpet fanfare will sound, and the second part of the academic procession will enter. The order is:

The Symbols and Regalia

The visual symbols of Vanderbilt University communicate our rich history and our vibrant future. The oak tree is a traditional symbol for education as well as for strength and longevity. The stylized oak leaf and acorn in the Vanderbilt logo were inspired by motifs from the Vanderbilt family coat of arms. The predominant colors in the Vanderbilt coat of arms are black and gold. The initial "V" has been used frequently throughout the years as an architectural detail on campus buildings. The Vanderbilt University wordmark incorporates two typefaces, graphically linking old and new, our history and our future.

The current chair of the Faculty Senate carries the mace, an ancient sign of authority. It is displayed on the front of the podium as the symbol of the university's authority to confer degrees. Symbolic images that decorate the gilded metal of the mace include VU monograms, embattled shields, oak leaves and acorns, irises and magnolias.

The Chancellor's insignia of office is a silver and gilt collar that displays several emblems of the university. The parallel chains of sterling silver are surmounted by alternating Vanderbilt shields and modified Founder's Medals, from which hangs a medallion with an impression of the seal of the university. The decagonal silver frame of the medallion symbolizes the ten schools.

Trustees of the university wear black gowns distinguished by gold piping on the velvet bars of the sleeves. The design of the academic regalia and the colors worn are significant. Undergraduates—those receiving bachelor's degrees—wear tassels signifying the degree they have earned: golden yellow for science, pink for music, and orange for engineering. By tradition, the bachelor of arts degree tassels are black.

The distinguishing mark of the gown is the sleeve: bachelor—a long, pointed sleeve; master—an oblong sleeve open at the wrist; doctor—open, pointed sleeves lined with dark blue satin to signify the Ph.D. Vanderbilt's custom gown for those receiving the doctor of philosophy has antique gold front and back panels and an embroidered "V" on the gown's yoke. Vanderbilt doctoral candidates wear eight-sided velvet tams with gold tassels.

The velvet edging of the doctoral hoods signifies whether the degree is J.D., M.D., Ed.D. or Ph.D.—purple for law, green for medicine, light blue for education, and dark blue for the doctor of philosophy, which may be earned in a number of disciplines. Masters' hoods are edged with white for arts, golden yellow for science, salmon pink for public health, scarlet for theology, light blue for education, orange for engineering, apricot for nursing, and light brown for business. All hoods are lined with silk in colors signifying the institution granting the degree. Vanderbilt hoods are lined in gold and bear a black chevron.

The Banner Bearers

Each banner, with a field in the appropriate academic color, is decorated with the Vanderbilt logo. In recognition of Peabody's history, a Peabody Centennial Medal in a round walnut frame is mounted above the banner. The Nichols–Chancellor's Medal is one of the university's highest honors and is awarded to individuals who define the 21st century and exemplify the best qualities of the human spirit. It was established by Vanderbilt Law School graduate Edward C. Nichols, Jr., and his wife, Janice, in memory of Edward Carmack Nichols and Lucile Hamby Nichols. The medal is presented at Vanderbilt's Senior Class Day and carries a cash prize.

The 2015 Nichols-Chancellor's Medal is presented to author and biographer Walter Isaacson, who is currently president of the Aspen Institute, a nonpartisan educational and policy studies institute based in Washington, D.C. He previously was chairman and CEO of CNN and editor of *TIME* magazine. He was appointed by President Barack Obama and confirmed by the Senate to serve as the chairman of the Broadcasting Board of Governors, which oversees Voice of America, Radio Free Europe, and other international broadcasts of the United States, a position he held until 2012. His publications include biographies of Steve Jobs, Albert Einstein, Benjamin Franklin, and Henry Kissinger. Most recently, he authored *The Innovators: How a Group of Inventors, Hackers, Geniuses, and Geeks Created the Digital Revolution*, a biographical tale of the people who invented the computer, the Internet, and the other great innovations of our time.

THE FOUNDER'S MEDAL RECIPIENTS

Danielle Jessup Beaujon, from West Bloomfield, Michigan, is this year's Founder's Medalist for the College of Arts and Science. She is graduating with a bachelor of arts.

Taking a wide range of courses early in her Vanderbilt career allowed Danielle "to experience new and provocative ways of looking at the world." She studied abroad in Aix-en-Provence, France, and a course there on North Africa inspired her honors research. Danielle's honors thesis in the Department of History compares the experiences of two populations of refugees who fled from Algeria to France in 1962. Fluent in French, she carried out research for her project in government archives in Marseilles. Danielle also participated in Momentum Dance Company, tutored refugee children at LEAD Academy Middle School, and performed with Vanderbilt Off-Broadway, her "most formative extracurricular activity at Vanderbilt." Following graduation, Danielle will pursue a Ph.D. in French history. She plans a career as a professor of history.

Elenora Grace Pertz, from Ashtabula, Ohio, is this year's Founder's Medalist for the Blair School of Music. She is graduating with a bachelor of music, with majors in piano performance and European studies.

Nora has been an effective leader on campus for the past four years. Active at Blair as a guide for prospective students and a SEGUE leader for first-year students, she has served on the university's Strategic Plan Advisory Committee, as the vice president of Go Figure, and as an IES Abroad Student Ambassador. She is a member of Kappa Delta sorority, where she served as the academic excellence chair. Nora has studied abroad three times in her collegiate career, including a semester abroad in Vienna, Austria, where she was the intern for the cast director and head of musical studies at the Vienna State Opera. A lover of languages, she graduated from the Middlebury German Language School and taught English while abroad. She also has six piano students that she teaches weekly in Nashville. After a summer internship at the Washington National Opera in arts administration, she will return to Vienna this fall for graduate study in collaborative piano at the Vienna Conservatory.

Akash Umakantha, from West Chester, Ohio, is this year's Founder's Medalist for the School of Engineering. He is graduating with a bachelor of engineering in electrical and biomedical engineering.

Akash has been a researcher at Cold Spring Harbor Laboratory, the Vanderbilt Radiation Effects and Reliability Group, and the Vanderbilt Department of Psychology. He has presented his research on models of decision-making at two international conferences. Working in Tom Palmeri's lab after freshman year, he learned about mathematical models of decision-making and how to simulate complex mathematical equations on a computer. That experience inspired him to pursue an academic career in neuroscience and scientific computing. Akash served as an engineering tutor, and he volunteered in a sixth-grade classroom through Vanderbilt Student Volunteers for Science. He is a member of Tau Beta Pi, the engineering honor society. Next fall, Akash will attend Carnegie Mellon University to pursue doctoral studies in neural computation and machine learning.

Sally Catherine Nichols, from Worthington, Ohio, is this year's Founder's Medalist for Peabody College. She is graduating with a bachelor of arts in elementary education with a second major in special education.

A Peabody Scholar, National Merit Scholar, and recipient of a Peabody Dean's Achievement Scholarship, Sally is an accomplished mentor and promising teacher. She began volunteering with TAP, The Afterschool Program, in her first year at Peabody, ultimately assuming leadership positions in the organization. As program director for TAP, Sally recruited more than 200 student mentors to commit to weekly service. She founded United Nashville, an intra-university student service organization for the Nashville community. In Sally's words, "Next year, I get to dive headfirst into my passion for urban education by teaching kids with multiple risk factors in Austin, Texas. I will be working as an elementary school special education teacher in grades K–3. I am thrilled to have my own classroom and start living out the Peabody way in my own little corner of the world."

Naomi Kathleen Yoder, from Knoxville, Tennessee, is this year's Founder's Medalist for the Divinity School. She is graduating with a master of divinity.

As a Brandon Scholar and as a fellow in the Cal Turner Program for Moral Leadership in the Professions, Naomi pursued her interest in pastoral theology and care through chaplaincy at the Monroe Carell Jr. Children's Hospital, through congregational ministry at the Community Mennonite Church in Harrisonburg, Virginia, and through prison ministry at Riverbend Maximum Security Institution in Nashville. She says, "One of the most meaningful experiences of my time at Vanderbilt has been my weekly fellowship with a man on Tennessee's death row. Our friendship and laughter have brought joy to my life and reinvigorated my desire to demand the acknowledgement of each person's humanity." Naomi participates in an occasional gathering of Divinity School students and community members to discuss issues of peace and non-violence as they relate to our faith commitments. Having earned her degree from the Divinity School, Naomi currently is discerning pastoral placement in the Mennonite Church, USA.

THE FOUNDER'S MEDAL RECIPIENTS

Nicholas Carter Gordon, from Charlotte, North Carolina, is this year's Founder's Medalist for the Owen Graduate School of Management. He is graduating with a master of business administration and earned a concentration in strategy and a 4.0 grade point average.

Inspired by his grandfather who served his country and built a successful collection of businesses, Nick completed an undergraduate degree in mechanical engineering at Vanderbilt. He received the Nancy and Bruce Bayer Honor Scholarship, a National Merit Scholarship, and a Mechanical Engineering Program Award. After college, Nick moved to Kenya for two years to build a non-profit organization called CARE for AIDS, which has now served more than 5,000 families, representing 15,000 children who are at the highest risk of death or abandonment due to HIV/AIDS. A Dean's Scholar at Owen, Nick shared last year's Bruce D. Henderson Prize for the highest GPA. He is a member of the board of directors for CARE for AIDS and was inducted into Beta Gamma Sigma, the International Business Honor Society, this spring. After graduation, Nick and his wife, Jane, will move to Atlanta where Nick will join the Boston Consulting Group.

Robin E. Frazer, from Lexington, Kentucky, is this year's Founder's Medalist for the Law School. She is graduating with a doctor of jurisprudence.

Robin's academic promise was recognized early in her college career as an Engage Scholar who received conditional acceptance to Vanderbilt Law School. Her undergraduate course work in community development and organizational theory taught valuable lessons about human interaction and the importance of relationships when helping those in need, providing an excellent foundation for her legal training. Robin is a Thomas R. McCoy Scholar and received numerous academic honors, including the Archie B. Martin and Robert F. Jackson Memorial Prizes, the Dean's Leadership Award, and many Scholastic Excellence Awards. She served as articles editor for the Vanderbilt Law Review and executive problem editor for the Moot Court Board, and was a recipient of the John A. Cortner Championship Award. After graduation, Robin will clerk for the Honorable John Rogers, United States Court of Appeals for the Sixth Circuit, in Lexington, Kentucky.

Rene Raphemot, from Libreville, Gabon, is this year's Founder's Medalist for the graduate school. He is graduating with a doctor of philosophy in pharmacology.

Rene conducted research that combined his passion for drug discovery and his desire to fight vector borne diseases. While immersed in his research studies in the Denton laboratory at Vanderbilt University, Rene participated in various graduate student-run organizations such as the Alliance for Cultural Diversity in Research and the Pharmacology Graduate Student Association. His research contribution

was lauded by distinctions awarded by the Society of General Physiologists, the Vanderbilt Institute of Chemical Biology, and the Vanderbilt Department of Anesthesiology. Rene's driven desire to find new strategies to prevent and fight malaria arises from his direct witness of the significant impact that this disease has on underdeveloped countries such as Gabon, his native country. Having had malaria, Rene knows personally the havoc it wreaks on families and communities in these affected regions. Rene is currently a postdoctoral associate at Duke University where he is conducting research on malaria.

Morgan Elizabeth De Kleine, from Pennington, New Jersey, is this year's Founder's Medalist for the School of Nursing. She is graduating with a master of science in nursing in the dual Nurse-Midwifery/Family Nurse Practitioner Program.

Morgan focused her research, practice, and volunteer activities on improving care for underserved women. She continued to learn about health care challenges in the U.S. through her clinical experiences in a nonprofit teaching hospital in Georgia and in the labor, delivery, and postpartum units at a rural New Mexico hospital. As Morgan learned more about health disparities in the U.S. and internationally, she discovered a passion to help address these inequities. She developed and implemented a preventive health education program for the well-woman exam process and also researched interventions to reduce mother-to-child HIV transmission in Mozambique. She was the first full-time M.S.N. student to earn a Graduate Certificate in Global Health. Morgan plans to practice as a nurse-midwife and family nurse practitioner in underserved areas and to pursue doctoral study.

Shyam Jayant Deshpande, from Nashville, Tennessee, is this year's Founder's Medalist for the School of Medicine. He is graduating with a doctor of medicine.

Shyam has been actively involved in medical education, making significant contributions to the academic mentoring of fellow students. He was elected to the Alpha Omega Alpha Medical Honor Society, received the Amos Christie Award (awarded to the graduating student who has "demonstrated the outstanding qualities of scholarship and humanity embodied by the ideal pediatrician"), and was recognized by his classmates with the Canby Robinson Society "Ideal Physician" award. While on clinical rotations at Vanderbilt, Shyam felt drawn to work with families in addition to pediatric patients; his time on the wards illuminated the importance of family in health care and healing. Shyam will complete his residency in pediatrics at Boston Children's Hospital. In the future, he hopes to pursue a career in pediatric critical care medicine, focused on the education and support of families, as well as discovery and delivery of the best care for critically ill children.
