


# VANDERBILT COMMENCEMENT

### THE ACADEMIC PROCESSION

he processional begins as the candidates for degrees march onto Alumni Lawn, school by school. Each group is preceded by a banner bearer and led by the dean and the Founder's Medalist for the school. The candidates move toward the platform from five directions.

#### I

Entering from the rear of the audience is the College of Arts and Science, marching in two columns and led by:

Dean Lauren A. Benton, followed by candidates for the degree of bachelor of arts. Their banner has a white field.

#### H

Entering from the rear to the left of the audience are the Law School and the School of Medicine.

They are led by:

Dean Chris Guthrie, Law School, followed by the faculty and the candidates for the degrees of master of laws and doctor of jurisprudence. Their banner has a purple field.

Dean Jeffrey R. Balser, School of Medicine, followed by the faculty and the candidates for the degrees of doctor of medicine, doctor of medical physics, doctor of audiology, master of education of the deaf, master of science (speech-language pathology), master of science in clinical investigation, master of science in medical physics, master of laboratory investigation, and master of public health. Their banner has a green field.

#### Ш

Entering from the left of the audience near the platform is the **Graduate School** led by:

Dean Mark T. Wallace, followed by the faculty and the candidates for the degrees of master of arts, master of science, master of fine arts, master of liberal arts and science, master of engineering, and doctor of philosophy. The banner for the doctor of philosophy has a dark blue field.

#### IV

Entering to the right of the audience are **Peabody College** and the **School of Nursing**. They are led by:

Dean Camilla P. Benbow, Peabody College, followed by the graduate faculty and the candidates for the degrees of doctor of education, master of education, master of public policy, and bachelor of science. Their banner has a light blue field.

Dean Linda D. Norman, School of Nursing, followed by the faculty and the candidates for the degrees of doctor of nursing practice and master of science in nursing. Their banner has an apricot field.

#### V

Entering from the rear to the right of the audience are the Blair School of Music, the School of Engineering, the Divinity School, and the Owen Graduate School of Management. They are led by:

Dean Mark Wait, Blair School of Music, followed by candidates for the degree of bachelor of music. Their banner has a pink field.

Dean Philippe M. Fauchet, School of Engineering, followed by candidates for the degrees of bachelor of engineering and bachelor of science. Their banner has an orange field.

Dean Emilie M. Townes, Divinity School, followed by the faculty and the candidates for the degrees of master of divinity and master of theological studies. Their banner has a scarlet field.

Dean M. Eric Johnson, Owen Graduate School of Management, followed by the faculty and the candidates for the degrees of master of business administration, master of accountancy, master of science in finance, master of marketing, and master of management in health care. Their banner has a light brown field.

fter the candidates are seated, trumpets will sound a fanfare and the first part of the academic procession will enter from the back of the audience. The order is:

Provost Susan R. Wente leading in the professors emeriti and the faculty

After the faculty have entered, another trumpet fanfare will sound, and the second part of the academic procession will enter. The order is:

### The Symbols and Regalia

The visual symbols of Vanderbilt University communicate our rich history and our vibrant future. The oak tree is a traditional symbol for education as well as for strength and longevity. The stylized oak leaf and acorn in the Vanderbilt logo were inspired by motifs from the Vanderbilt family coat of arms. The predominant colors in the Vanderbilt coat of arms are black and gold. The initial "V" has been used frequently throughout the years as an architectural detail on campus buildings. The Vanderbilt University wordmark incorporates two typefaces, graphically linking old and new, our history and our future.

The current chair of the Faculty Senate carries the mace, an ancient sign of authority. It is displayed on the front of the podium as the symbol of the university's authority to confer degrees. Symbolic images that decorate the gilded metal of the mace include VU monograms, embattled shields, oak leaves and acorns, irises and magnolias.

The chancellor's insignia of office is a silver and gilt collar that displays several emblems of the university. The parallel chains of sterling silver are surmounted by alternating Vanderbilt shields and modified Founder's Medals, from which hangs a medallion with an impression of the seal of the university. The decagonal silver frame of the medallion symbolizes the ten schools.

Trustees of the university wear black gowns distinguished by gold piping on the velvet bars of the sleeves. The design of the academic regalia and the colors worn are significant. Undergraduates—those receiving bachelor's degrees—wear tassels signifying the degree they have earned: golden yellow for science, pink for music, and orange for engineering. By tradition, the bachelor of arts degree tassels are black.

The distinguishing mark of the gown is the sleeve: bachelor—a long, pointed sleeve; master—an oblong sleeve open at the wrist; doctor—open, pointed sleeves lined with dark blue satin to signify the Ph.D. Vanderbilt's custom gown for those receiving the doctor of philosophy has antique gold front and back panels and an embroidered "V" on the gown's yoke. Vanderbilt doctoral candidates wear eight-sided velvet tams with gold tassels.

The velvet edging of the doctoral hoods signifies whether the degree is J.D., M.D., Ed.D., D.N.P., or Ph.D.—purple for law, green for medicine, light blue for education, apricot for nursing, and dark blue for the doctor of philosophy, which may be earned in a number of disciplines. Masters' hoods are edged with white for arts, brown for fine arts, gold for science, purple for law, salmon pink for public health, peacock blue for public policy, scarlet for theology, light blue for education, orange for engineering, apricot for nursing, and light brown for business. All hoods are lined with silk in colors signifying the institution granting the degree. Vanderbilt hoods are lined in gold and bear a black chevron.

#### The Banner Bearers

Each banner, with a field in the appropriate academic color, is decorated with the Vanderbilt logo. In recognition of Peabody's history, a Peabody Centennial Medal in a round walnut frame is mounted above the banner. The Nichols–Chancellor's Medal is one of the university's highest honors and is awarded to individuals who define the 21st century and exemplify the best qualities of the human spirit. It was established by Vanderbilt Law School graduate Edward C. Nichols, Jr., and his wife, Janice, in memory of Edward Carmack Nichols and Lucile Hamby Nichols. The medal is presented at Vanderbilt's Senior Class Day and also carries a monetary award.

The 2017 Nichols-Chancellor's Medal is presented to filmmaker Ken Burns who has produced some of the most watched documentaries on public television. Since the Academy Award-nominated *Brooklyn Bridge* in 1981, he has gone on to direct and produce some of the most acclaimed historical documentaries ever made, including *The Civil War, Baseball, Jazz, The Statue of Liberty, Huey Long, Lewis & Clark, The Journey of the Corps of Discovery, Frank Lloyd Wright, Mark Twain, Unforgivable Blackness: The Rise and Fall of Jack Johnson, The War, The National Parks: America's Best Idea, The Roosevelts: An Intimate History, Jackie Robinson, and, most recently, Defying the Nazis: The Sharps' War. His films have been honored with dozens of major awards, including fifteen Emmy Awards, two Grammy Awards, and two Oscar nominations. In 2008, the National Academy of Television Arts & Sciences honored him with a Lifetime Achievement Award. His future projects include films on the Vietnam War, the history of country music, Ernest Hemingway, and the history of stand-up comedy.*

### THE FOUNDER'S MEDAL RECIPIENTS

Mary Grace Johnson, from Murfreesboro, Tennessee, is this year's Founder's Medalist for the Blair School of Music. She is graduating with a bachelor of music.

A Cornelius Vanderbilt Scholar and an accomplished violinist, Mary Grace won the 2017 National MTNA Young Artist competition in Baltimore, Maryland, and the 2016 Vanderbilt concerto competition. She has performed as a soloist with the Nashville Symphony and as concertmaster of the Vanderbilt University Orchestra. In 2016, she was the featured performer at Vanderbilt Commencement. Mary Grace is the sixth of nine siblings, almost all of whom have pursued music professionally to some degree. Her parents also play instruments, and her father, a pianist, was very influential in developing her love of music. Mary Grace is passionate about teaching and has volunteered at the W. O. Smith Music School since 2014, in addition to maintaining a private teaching studio and coaching precollege chamber music groups at Blair. She has been a resident adviser at Vanderbilt since 2014 and has organized and performed in informal Blair concerts in the residence halls. This fall, she will move to New York to pursue her master's degree in violin performance at the Juilliard School.

**Duncan Matthew Morgan,** from Woodstock, Georgia, is this year's Founder's Medalist for the School of Engineering. He is graduating with a bachelor of engineering in chemical engineering, chemistry, and mathematics.

Duncan's research at Vanderbilt focused on the engineering of thin film coatings to improve the efficacy of vaccines. He plans to expand his research in graduate school to design new medical technologies, therapies, and diagnostic techniques. Duncan's favorite Vanderbilt experiences include his leadership of the Vanderbilt Quiz Bowl, which organizes trivia

tournaments for high school teams, and his two Alternative Spring Break service trips. In his junior year, he traveled to Saint Paul, Minnesota, to work on a project to meet the needs of the Tibetan-American community, and for his senior-year ASB project, he worked in Saint Louis, Missouri, with Lifebridge Partnership, an organization that helps people with physical and intellectual disabilities to actively participate in their communities. Duncan was awarded a National Science Foundation Graduate Research Fellowship, and, this fall, he will begin work on a doctorate in chemical engineering at the Massachusetts Institute of Technology.

**Lauren Somers Heyano,** from Anchorage, Alaska, is this year's Founder's Medalist for Peabody College and is graduating with a bachelor of science.

Lauren believes that there are many ways to do good in the world, an insight she formed by becoming part of a community of diverse classmates in a course titled Children in Families and Schools. She pursued her own passions for doing good during her time at Vanderbilt through volunteer work and other learning opportunities that focused on social justice, health, and education. She founded Vanderbilt Association of Introverts, a student organization dedicated to appreciating and exploring introversion, and thereby created not only a way to feel less alone as an introvert herself, but also a place where other introverts were seen and valued. Lauren came to Vanderbilt as a Cornelius Vanderbilt Scholar and graduates with a major in child studies. A first-generation college graduate, she plans to return to her home state of Alaska to pursue opportunities in writing and in the nonprofit sector.

**Dorothy Elizabeth Parks-Piatt,** from Chattanooga, Tennessee, is this year's Founder's Medalist for the Divinity School. She is graduating with a master of divinity.

A Harold Stirling Vanderbilt Scholar pursuing ordination in the Presbyterian Church (USA), Dorothy bridged her academic and pastoral interests as an Arcus Foundation Justice through Engagement researcher and pastoral intern at Second Presbyterian Church. Her contributions focused especially on faith-based communal learning and social action at the intersections of religions, race, class, gender, and sexuality. Among other service commitments, Dorothy served on the Divinity School's worship committee, participated in a prison ministry program on death row at Riverbend Maximum Security Institute, was involved in Nashville's faith working group, "Showing Up for Racial Justice," provided traumainformed care for young men in the state's custody as a residential specialist at Monroe Harding, Inc., and participated in the Presbyterian Church (USA) Company of New Pastors Vanderbilt chapter. Dorothy has accepted a pastoral call to the Resident Ministry Program at First Presbyterian Church in Ann Arbor, Michigan.

### THE FOUNDER'S MEDAL RECIPIENTS

**Aaron Jackson Dorn,** from Nashville, Tennessee, is this year's Founder's Medalist for the Owen Graduate School of Management and is graduating with a master of business administration.

Before coming to Vanderbilt, Aaron was a co-founder and senior leader at a commercial bank in Nashville. He left that executive role to attend Owen, with the goal of launching his own company while earning an MBA. Previously deployed by the United States Marine Corps to Afghanistan in support of Operation Enduring Freedom, Aaron benefitted from the support of the GI Bill and the Yellow Ribbon program, as well as Vanderbilt scholarship donors. The MBA program's entrepreneurship curriculum helped Aaron move toward his goal, as he completed a series of independent studies and received the Bruce D. Henderson Scholarship for attaining highest honors in his first year. In March, Aaron successfully raised the necessary capital for his new venture in Nashville's banking industry, recruited a start-up team, and launched his company. After graduation, Aaron will remain in Nashville as president and CEO of the company he created.

**Laura Elizabeth Dolbow,** from Alpharetta, Georgia, is this year's Founder's Medalist from the Law School. She is graduating with a doctor of jurisprudence.

Laura excelled in her legal studies throughout her time at Vanderbilt. She was the recipient of the Archie B. Martin Memorial Prize for Scholarship for the highest scholastic average after the first year, the Robert F. Jackson Memorial Prize for the highest scholastic average after the second year, and the Morgan Prize for the outstanding piece of student writing for the Vanderbilt Law Review, for which she served as senior articles editor. She was named a Dean's Scholar and Thomas R. McCoy Scholar, served as director of the Street Law program, and participated in the Legal Aid Society. After graduation, Laura will clerk in 2017 for the Honorable Timothy Dyk, U.S. Court of Appeals for the Federal Circuit, Washington, D.C., followed in 2018 by a clerkship with the Honorable Judith Rogers, U.S. Court of Appeals for the D.C. Circuit.

**Emily Alden Hennessy,** from Red Hook, New York, is this year's Founder's Medalist for the Graduate School. She is graduating with a doctor of philosophy in community research and action.

As a Fulbright scholar studying in Norway, Emily began to reshape and broaden how she defined health and came to realize how settings—homes, neighborhoods, schools, communities—could foster or impede health. She continued her studies at Vanderbilt to better understand how people and their contexts interact to produce high, or low, life quality and how research and better programming could positively intervene. In the course of her studies, she has authored twelve peer-reviewed publications and three book chapters on adolescent health

behaviors. She received an award from the James N. Morgan Fund for New Directions in the Analysis of Complex Interactions to fund her dissertation, which combined the study of adolescent addiction with her quantitative expertise. In June, Emily begins a postdoctoral fellowship with the Systematic Health Action Research Program lab at the University of Connecticut, where she will collaborate on projects related to health behavior.

**Beverly Michelle Padgett,** from Portland, Tennessee, is this year's Founder's Medalist for the School of Nursing. She is graduating with a master of science in nursing.

Shelly graduated magna cum laude from Tennessee State University in 1997 and spent more than fifteen years as a registered nurse at Vanderbilt University Medical Center. Returning to school for her master's in nursing was challenging, but her courses and clinicals, and her complete dedication to the work, helped Shelly discover a new passion and a new direction: to be a nursing leader. It's unexpected when a student's course work impacts an entire organization, but that happened with some of Shelly's Health Care Leadership projects. During practicums at VUMC, she researched and developed nurse retention plans and patient post-discharge models that the Medical Center implemented. Her qualityimprovement research for a nurse residency program improved participation and reduced the program's cost. Currently, Shelly works in VUMC's Nursing Education and Professional Development office and plans to pursue further leadership positions and perhaps a doctor of nursing practice degree.

**Samantha Gridley Haley,** from Milton, Georgia, is this year's Founder's Medalist for the School of Medicine. She is graduating with a doctor of medicine and a certificate in LGBT health.

Samantha entered medical school with a bachelor's in English and an interest in social and behavioral determinants of health. During her medical school rotation in adolescent medicine, she found her niche. Through this field that combines primary care, sexual health, and mental health, she looks forward to caring for patients at an age when they are molding their self-identity and making choices that can cement into lifelong habits. She has a special interest in providing compassionate, equitable care for LGBT youth. As a medical student, she served as a fellow of the Cal Turner Program for Moral Leadership in the Professions, completed the Vanderbilt Program for Interprofessional Learning, and led numerous student organizations. Her research on barriers to health care for transgender youth earned the Society for Pediatric Research Student Research Award, which is granted to three medical students each year. Samantha also published multiple award-winning essays as a medical student and was inducted into both Alpha Omega Alpha and the Gold Humanism Honor Society. Samantha plans to complete her pediatric residency at Seattle Children's Hospital and then pursue fellowship training in adolescent medicine.
