

### THE ACADEMIC PROCESSION

he processional begins as the candidates for degrees march onto Alumni Lawn, school by school. Each group is preceded by a banner bearer and led by the dean and the Founder's Medalist for the school. The candidates move toward the platform from five directions.

#### I

Entering from the rear of the audience is the College of Arts and Science, marching in two columns and led by:

Dean John Geer, followed by candidates for the degree of bachelor of arts. Their banner has a white field.

#### H

Entering from the rear to the left of the audience are the Law School and the School of Medicine. They are led by:

Dean Chris Guthrie, Law School, followed by the faculty and the candidates for the degrees of master of laws and doctor of jurisprudence. Their banner has a purple field.

Dean Jeffrey R. Balser, School of Medicine, followed by the faculty and the candidates for the degrees of doctor of medicine, doctor of medical physics, doctor of audiology, master of education of the deaf, master of science (speech-language pathology), master of science in applied clinical informatics, master of science in clinical investigation, master of science in medical physics, master of laboratory investigation, and master of public health. Their banner has a green field.

#### Ш

Entering from the left of the audience near the platform is the **Graduate School** led by:

Dean Mark T. Wallace, followed by the faculty and the candidates for the degrees of master of arts, master of science, master of fine arts, master of liberal arts and science, master of engineering, and doctor of philosophy. The banner for the doctor of philosophy has a dark blue field.

#### IV

Entering to the right of the audience are **Peabody College** and the **School of Nursing**. They are led by:

Dean Camilla P. Benbow, Peabody College, followed by the graduate faculty and the candidates for the degrees of doctor of education, master of education, master of public policy, and bachelor of science. Their banner has a light blue field.

Dean Linda D. Norman, School of Nursing, followed by the faculty and the candidates for the degrees of doctor of nursing practice and master of science in nursing. Their banner has an apricot field.

#### V

Entering from the rear to the right of the audience are the Blair School of Music, the School of Engineering, the Divinity School, and the Owen Graduate School of Management. They are led by:

Dean Mark Wait, Blair School of Music, followed by candidates for the degree of bachelor of music. Their banner has a pink field.

Dean Philippe M. Fauchet, School of Engineering, followed by candidates for the degrees of bachelor of engineering and bachelor of science. Their banner has an orange field.

Dean Emilie M. Townes, Divinity School, followed by the faculty and the candidates for the degrees of master of divinity and master of theological studies. Their banner has a scarlet field.

Dean M. Eric Johnson, Owen Graduate School of Management, followed by the faculty and the candidates for the degrees of master of business administration, master of accountancy, master of science in finance, master of marketing, and master of management in health care. Their banner has a light brown field.

fter the candidates are seated, trumpets will sound a fanfare and the first part of the academic procession will enter from the back of the audience. The order is:

After the faculty have entered, another trumpet fanfare will sound, and the second part of the academic procession will enter.

### The Symbols and Regalia

The visual symbols of Vanderbilt University communicate our rich history and our vibrant future. The oak tree is a traditional symbol for education as well as for strength and longevity. The stylized oak leaf and acorn in the Vanderbilt logo were inspired by motifs from the Vanderbilt family coat of arms. The predominant colors in the Vanderbilt coat of arms are black and gold. The initial "V" has been used frequently throughout the years as an architectural detail on campus buildings. The Vanderbilt University wordmark incorporates two typefaces, graphically linking old and new, our history and our future.

The current chair of the Faculty Senate carries the mace, an ancient sign of authority. It is displayed on the front of the podium as the symbol of the university's authority to confer degrees. Symbolic images that decorate the gilded metal of the mace include VU monograms, embattled shields, oak leaves and acorns, irises and magnolias.

The chancellor's insignia of office is a silver and gilt collar that displays several emblems of the university. The parallel chains of sterling silver are surmounted by alternating Vanderbilt shields and modified Founder's Medals, from which hangs a medallion with an impression of the seal of the university. The decagonal silver frame of the medallion symbolizes the ten schools.

Trustees of the university wear black gowns distinguished by gold piping on the velvet bars of the sleeves. The design of the academic regalia and the colors worn are significant. Undergraduates—those receiving bachelor's degrees—wear tassels signifying the degree they have earned: golden yellow for science, pink for music, and orange for engineering. By tradition, the bachelor of arts degree tassels are black.

The distinguishing mark of the gown is the sleeve: bachelor—a long, pointed sleeve; master—an oblong sleeve open at the wrist; doctor—open, pointed sleeves lined with dark blue satin to signify the Ph.D. Vanderbilt's custom gown for those receiving the doctor of philosophy has antique gold front and back panels and an embroidered "V" on the gown's yoke. Vanderbilt doctoral candidates wear eight-sided velvet tams with gold tassels.

The velvet edging of the doctoral hoods signifies whether the degree is J.D., M.D., Ed.D., D.N.P., or Ph.D.—purple for law, green for medicine, light blue for education, apricot for nursing, and dark blue for the doctor of philosophy, which may be earned in a number of disciplines. Masters' hoods are edged with white for arts, brown for fine arts, gold for science, purple for law, salmon pink for public health, peacock blue for public policy, scarlet for theology, light blue for education, orange for engineering, apricot for nursing, and light brown for business. All hoods are lined with silk in colors signifying the institution granting the degree. Vanderbilt hoods are lined in gold and bear a black chevron.

The Nichols-Chancellor's Medal is one of the university's highest honors and is awarded to individuals who define the 21st century and exemplify the best qualities of the human spirit. It was established by Vanderbilt Law School graduate Edward C. Nichols, Jr., and his wife, Janice, in memory of Edward Carmack Nichols and Lucile Hamby Nichols. The medal is presented at Vanderbilt's Senior Class Day and also carries a monetary award.

The 2019 Nichols-Chancellor's Medal is presented to tennis legend Venus Williams, who is among the most accomplished and inspiring women in the history of sports—holding seven Grand Slam titles, five Wimbledon championships, and four Olympic gold medals. Williams' ascent began at the age of 14, when she took the tennis world by storm with her confidence and outstanding performances. Today, Williams continues to compete on a global stage, and has also made waves as a designer, advocate, entrepreneur, and New York Times bestselling author. As a testament to her creative side, Williams has gone on to found V Starr Interiors, a full-service commercial and residential interior design firm, as well as her activewear brand, EleVen, the largest apparel line ever launched by a female athlete.

Beneath all of these accomplishments, Williams is also a persistent champion of equality. The United Nations cultural organization, UNESCO, titled her the first "Promoter of Gender Equality," and the Anti-Defamation League (ADL) honored Williams with the Americanism Award for publicly defending Israeli player Shahar Pe'er, who was barred from the Dubai tennis tournament. In addition, she has been honored as *Glamour* magazine's "Woman of the Year," and ESPN's "WTA Player of the Year," and has secured a spot in *Vogue* magazine's "Top 10 Best Dressed" list, among countless other accomplishments.

#### THE FOUNDER'S MEDAL RECIPIENTS

**Ethan Chervonski,** from Peachtree Corners, Georgia, is this year's Founder's Medalist for the College of Arts and Science. He is graduating with a bachelor of arts.

Since his freshman year, Ethan has worked in the lab of Assistant Professor of Cell and Developmental Biology Rebecca Ihrie, researching how different populations of stem cells contribute to tumor development in the brain. He also worked with Professor of History Marshall Eakin as part of a team assessing health care in Brazil. The Brazil project helped Ethan gain understanding of how health is impacted by politics, the criminal justice system, poverty, and other issues of health care access. Ethan plans to combine his research training in neuroscience with insights about the human condition he has gained through the social sciences and humanities to develop patient-centered care as a physician. He will spend the next year doing post-baccalaureate research in the Ihrie Lab, after which he plans to apply to medical school.

**Brigit Maynard Fitzgerald,** from Phoenix, Arizona, is this year's Founder's Medalist for the Blair School of Music. She is graduating with a bachelor of music.

Brigit is almost as passionate about math as she is about music. She graduates with a degree in bassoon performance, a second major in mathematics, and a minor in scientific computing. A Cornelius Vanderbilt Scholar, Brigit won the Elliott and Ailsa Newman Award for Excellence in woodwind performance, has been a winner of the Vanderbilt Orchestra Concerto Competition, and previously performed as a soloist with the Phoenix Symphony. She spent summer 2018 at the prestigious Aspen Music Festival and School, and summer 2017 at the Vanderbilt Musique Academie in Aix-en-Provence, France. She also enjoyed sharing her knowledge of the bassoon with students in Colombia during a trip with the Vanderbilt Wind Symphony in spring 2018. After she and her twin sister, Abbey, graduate from Blair, Brigit will pursue a master of music in bassoon performance at the University of Texas at Austin.

**David K. Zhang,** from Clarksville, Tennessee, is this year's Founder's Medalist for the School of Engineering. He is graduating with a bachelor of science.

Science and technology and the combining of computational and theoretical tools are David's passions, and he has developed skills and knowledge through a triple major in computer science, mathematics, and physics. As a graduate student, he plans to continue working at the intersection of these areas. "As the scope of scientific inquiry and the sizes of available data sets continue to expand," David says, "I believe that these combined skills will become increasingly necessary to answer our biggest questions." David co-founded the Vanderbilt chapter of the Association for Computing Machinery and served on the Undergraduate Honor Council.

He has been recognized for academic performance, promise as a research leader, and skills as a speaker. After graduation, David will intern as a software engineer at Microsoft, followed by doctoral studies in applied mathematics and scientific computing at Stanford University.

**Emily Joellen Burgess,** from Kingsport, Tennessee, is this year's Founder's Medalist for Peabody College. She is graduating with a bachelor of science.

Emily graduates with majors in human & organizational development and history & economics and a minor in philosophy. While at Vanderbilt, Emily devoted time to serving vulnerable communities. In her first year, she co-founded a local chapter of Project RISHI, a national nonprofit aimed at improving the human condition in rural India. Emily also helped create a service-learning course in which students work with local community partners to better the lives of refugees in Nashville. As part of her HOD capstone project, Emily worked through the Nashville Office of Family Safety with victims of domestic abuse and sexual assault, and with legal professionals advising those victims. Emily sees a career in public service as her greatest means of empowering and supporting her community and plans to attend Vanderbilt Law School in the fall to work toward this goal. She acknowledges her family's love and encouragement for helping her along her path.

Maria Angeline Michonski, from Chapmansboro, Tennessee, is this year's Founder's Medalist for the Divinity School. She is graduating with a master of divinity.

With a full-tuition Dean's Scholarship at the Divinity School, Maria has immersed herself in her studies, focusing on religion, gender, and sexuality. She expanded and enriched her experience and knowledge through involvement in campus groups including the Vanderbilt Office of LGBTQI Life, the Margaret Cuninggim Women's Center, and the Vanderbilt Queerality Affinity Group. She was also a summer institute intern for the Public Theology and Racial Justice Collaborative for the Divinity School. Maria aspires to work in the nonprofit sector after graduation in fields related to gender, sexuality, and justice to create sacramental experiences for LGBTQIA+people in the South. She also hopes to become a practitioner of biodynamic farming and help to educate people on holistic, ecological, and ethical approaches to farming and gardening.

**Matthew Kemper Davis**, from Montgomery, Alabama, is this year's Founder's Medalist for the Owen Graduate School of Management and is graduating with a master of business administration.

After beginning a career in management consulting at the Houston office of PricewaterhouseCoopers, Matthew arrived at the Owen School motivated, as he always is, by memories

Matthew has worked hard at Owen, earning a 4.0 GPA and devoting time to the Owen Finance Club and to nonprofit organizations such as the Juvenile Diabetes Research Foundation, Savefirst free tax preparation service, and Tutormate, which helps first-grade students in low-income communities learn to read. Matthew's wife, Danielle, is studying in Vanderbilt's Adult-Gerontology Acute Care Nurse Practitioner program (Class of 2020) and is attending Commencement along with her parents, Matthew's mother, Kelly Davis, and his older brother, Andrew Davis. After graduation, Matthew will begin a career in oil and gas investment banking at Goldman Sachs in Houston.

**Joshua Burton Landis,** from Hamilton, Massachusetts, is this year's Founder's Medalist from the Law School. He is graduating with a doctor of jurisprudence.

Josh's honors at Vanderbilt Law School include the Archie B. Martin Memorial Prize for Scholarship, for the highest average for the first year, achieving Dean's List all semesters, serving as the Notes editor for the *Vanderbilt Law Review*, and being selected for the Myron Penn Laughlin Note Award for contributing the best student note published in the *Vanderbilt Law Review*. Josh was a John Wade Law Scholar, was a Moot Court finalist, for which he received the Best Oralist award, and was selected for Phi Delta Phi Legal Honor Society. He also served as a Law School Ambassador and as the president and treasurer of Cork & Tap Legal Society. After clerking for the Honorable Karen Le Craft Henderson, U.S. Court of Appeals for the District of Columbia Circuit, Washington, D.C., Josh will join Latham & Watkins in Menlo Park, California, as an associate.

**Ian Miller Williams,** from Petaluma, California, is this year's Founder's Medalist for the Graduate School. He is graduating with a doctor of philosophy in molecular physiology and biophysics.

Ian is fascinated with blood vessels. After a year of trying and failing, he was mesmerized when he could finally observe blood flow in the leg of a live mouse under the microscope. This passion has inspired his scientific career in vascular biology and laid the foundation for a prestigious grant from the National Institutes of Health. As a scientist, his goal is to discover treatments for metabolic and cardiovascular diseases by running his own laboratory in an academic setting. And because he wants his work to impact public health, he will also seek opportunities to take his discoveries from the laboratory to the clinic, to directly benefit patients. Ian is currently a postdoctoral fellow at Stanford University, studying the cells that line blood vessels, and he hopes to continue learning more about them for the rest of his career.

**Brooke M. Faught,** from Brentwood, Tennessee, is this year's Founder's Medalist for the School of Nursing. She is graduating with a doctor of nursing practice.

When Brooke decided to work toward a doctor of nursing practice degree, she was already a successful entrepreneur and nurse practitioner. In 2005, she developed the Women's Institute for Sexual Health, and she has turned WISH into an internationally recognized center. A few years after the center launched, Brooke's daughter was born with Down syndrome, and Brooke began a mission to pave the path for her daughter and all women with intellectual and developmental disabilities to receive relevant and appropriate sexuality education. Her doctoral project, "Social Boundaries in Young-Adult Females with Down Syndrome as a Foundation for Sexuality Education," has the potential to change how health care providers talk about sexuality with their patients with intellectual and developmental disabilities. After graduation, Brooke will continue this work, as well as her role as health care provider, director of WISH, and part-time faculty member for the School of Nursing.

**Jessica Lindsay Burris,** from Midlothian, Virginia, is this year's Founder's Medalist for the School of Medicine. She is graduating with a doctor of medicine.

Jessica spent time as a patient during her early years of medical school, recovering from a long-term illness. The physicians she encountered became her model of effective doctor-patient interactions and inspired her to develop interpersonal skills, as well as medical knowledge, as a student. "Effective communication brings understanding to suffering," Jessica says. "And compassion, when practiced skillfully in the setting of strong medical knowledge and clinical acumen, is inherently healing." Jessica's resilience and positive attitude are matched by her exemplary leadership, research, and service and exceptional academic and clinical performance. She has held national leadership roles developing and implementing a patient-powered research network, was selected for Alpha Omega Alpha Honor Medical Society and the Gold Humanism Honor Society, and delivered the 2019 Vanderbilt Flexner Medical Student Lecture. She will be continuing her training in psychiatry at Yale University.

This award is given to a post-doctoral fellow in the Department of Psychology who has demonstrated outstanding achievement in research.

FRANK A. WOODS AWARD IN HISTORY. Mr. James Lachs, BS'93, established this award in honor of Frank A. Woods, BA'63, LLB'66. A certificate, and \$250, will be given to a graduating senior in the College of Arts and Science who is majoring in history, economics and history, or law, history, and society, and has the highest grade point average.

JAMES L. RAY AWARD. Presented annually to the outstanding senior political science major for leadership and service to the department and the university. Award shared by:

JUM C. NUNNALLY DISSERTATION AWARD. The Jum C. Nunnally Dissertation Award recognizes a recent outstanding doctoral dissertation in the Department of Psychology. Jum C. Nunnally came to Vanderbilt in 1960. In 1961, he became the second chair of the department. He served as chair 1961–1964 and again 1967–1970. Under Jum's leadership, the department grew substantially in stature, including significant increases in both the number and quality of the faculty. A memorial fund to support student awards was

established in 1982 by his friends and family. Proceeds from this fund were used to establish the Jum C. Nunnally Dissertation Award in 2010.

THE FULBRIGHT U.K. SUMMER INSTITUTES. The Fulbright U.K. Summer Institutes are three-to-four-week programs for U.S. undergraduate students. Students selected explore the culture, heritage and history of the U.K., while experiencing higher education at a U.K. university. Award shared by:

 GILMAN SCHOLARSHIP. The U.S. Department of State's Benjamin A. Gilman International Scholarship is a grant program that enables students of limited financial means to study or intern abroad, thereby gaining skills critical to our national security and economic prosperity. A Gilman Scholarship enables American students to gain proficiency in diverse languages and cultures, skills that are critically important to their academic and career development.

GLENN AND ELIZABETH BOGITSH AWARD. In 1989, the Bogitsh award was established in memory of Vanderbilt alumni Glenn Carlisle, BS'82, and Elizabeth Norris Bogitsh, BS'77, in order to recognize high standards in physical fitness, participation in recreational sports, and sportsmanship. This award is given annually to a Vanderbilt undergraduate or graduate student who has best demonstrated a strong commitment to campus recreation programs and through example and leadership has inspired participation and sportsmanlike conduct in recreational activities.

GOLDWATER SCHOLARS. The Goldwater scholarship program, honoring the late Sen. Barry M. Goldwater, was designed to foster and encourage outstanding students to pursue careers in the fields of mathematics, the natural sciences, and engineering. Each scholarship provides up to \$7,500 for the scholar's junior or senior year. The Goldwater Scholarship is the premier undergraduate award of its type in these fields. Award shared by:

HENRIETTA MORGAN MEMORIAL AWARD. Each year, the Writing Studio conducts the competition for the Henrietta Morgan Memorial Award for first-year writers. Established by William Morgan in memory of his wife, the award goes to the first-year students who submit the best samples of original writing.

IMANI AWARD: THE REVEREND JAMES LAWSON AWARD FOR CAMPUS AND COMMUNITY LEADERSHIP. The Imani Award honors the Rev. James Lawson, who served as a faithful and determined leader in the African American community during the civil rights movement and is still very active today, including teaching here at Vanderbilt. Imani is the Swahili word for "Faith." Funded by the Bishop Joseph Johnson Black Cultural Center, this award recognizes a graduating senior who has continuously been an integral part of campus life and has demonstrated an outstanding capacity for leadership and devotion to Vanderbilt. The senior recipient receives a monetary award and a trophy to commemorate the award.

Morgan Newman-Perry ...... Bloomington, Ind.

THE JIM LEESON PRIZE. This prize is awarded annually to the student journalist at Vanderbilt University who best exemplifies the value of fairness and impartiality in reporting. Such reporting shows respect for all parties, especially on divisive and controversial issues, and a commitment to reporting facts as clearly, honestly, and thoroughly as possible. Jim Leeson was a journalist and teacher who, in the 1970s and 1980s, was the consultant journalist at Vanderbilt Student Communications. He always set high standards for reporting, with a particular emphasis on fairness, whatever the subject or controversy.

JIM ROBINS AWARD. Given to perpetuate the memory of James A. Robins, Class of 1892, whose "life and teachings exemplified selfless devotion to learning, to honor, to participation in...sports, and to service to youth and alma mater." Awarded annually "to a Vanderbilt athlete of the senior class in whose life these virtues are most evident." Endowed by Michael G. Wagner, Class of 1957.

JOHN T. MCGILL AWARD. Established in 1960 by Lizzie Allen McGill, this award is presented in memory of her husband, John T. McGill. This

award is presented to a McGill Hall resident who has established qualities of leadership, as well as being a good student of gentle bearing. Award winners have actively participated in the McGill Project, achieved academically, and demonstrated leadership in creating a more welcoming campus for all.

Samantha Jean Heller .......Wexford, Pa.

THE JOHN T. AND LIZZIE ALLEN MCGILL FIRST-YEAR AWARD. Established in 1994, these awards are given to two academically accomplished first-year students of gentle bearing and strong character who have shown kindness and respect for all others and who have established qualities of leadership. Award winners have demonstrated academic accomplishment and leadership in creating a more welcoming campus for all. Award shared by:

THE JOHN T. AND LIZZIE ALLEN MCGILL UPPERCLASS AWARD. This student should be one who has demonstrated courage and resilience in the face of troubling circumstances and a willingness to humbly promote the betterment of the Vanderbilt community. In addition to his involvement in civil

rights since his youth, Rev. Asbury brought to Vanderbilt a sense of life, commitment, and tolerance that changed the culture on campus forever. A true humanitarian and bridge builder, Rev. Asbury brought together students, staff, faculty, and the community in conversation when it was needed most. This award is given to an undergraduate student who exhibits the mindset of Rev.
